


- 5. In case of withdrawal (Discontinue) from the college, students should pay the fees for the course duration. (Though the classes have not yet begun).8.H o s t e l facility could be withdrawn only at the end of the semester.

- 6. University Examination Fee is to be remitted within the time prescribed by the University.
- 7. Hostel fees should be remitted for the full academic year (12 months).

RULES AND REGULATIONS


