FEES AND PAYMENTS

There are two semesters in a year.

1. Student should remit the prescribed fee for each semester within the stipulated time as mentioned in the calendar.
2. Fees will be collected from 9.00a.m to 5.00 p. m on all working days.
3. Receipts issued for all payments should be kept safe.
4. Fees once paid will not be refunded under any circumstance.
5. In case of withdrawal (Discontinue) from the college, students should pay the fees for the course duration. (Though the classes have not yet begun).
6. University Examination Fee is to be remitted within the time prescribed by the University.
7. Hostel fees should be remitted for the full academic year (12 months).
8. Hostel facility could be withdrawn only at the end of the semester.

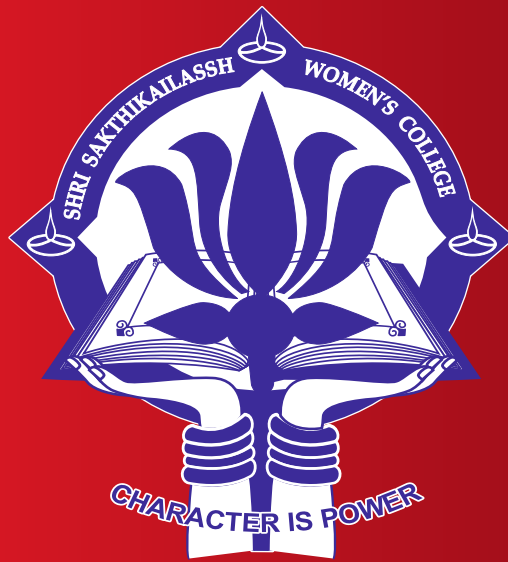
