FEES AND PAYMENTS

There are two semesters in a year.

- 1. Student should remit the prescribed fee for each semester within the stipulated time as mentioned in the calendar.
- 2. Fees will be collected from 9.00a.m to 5.00 p. m on all working days.
- 3. Receipts issued for all payments should be kept safe.
- 4. Fees once paid will not be refunded under any circumstance.
- In case of withdrawal (Discontinue) from the college, students should pay the fees for the course duration.
 (Though the classes have not yet begun).
- 6. University Examination Fee is to be remitted within the time prescribed by the University.
- 7. Hostel fees should be remitted for the full academic year (12 months).
- 8. Hostel facility could be withdrawn only at the end of the semester.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. All the students must assemble in their respective classrooms by 9.40a.m. The day begins with a common morning prayer. After the prayer the class work begins at 9.45a.m.

- 3. Important circulars relating to the day-today affair of the college will be on the notice board and the ignorance of any notice will not be accepted as an excuse for failing to comply with it.
- 4. No meetings of any kind shall be organized in the college without prior permission of the principal & management.
- 5. Leave or permission to a group or whole class will not be granted on any account for the purposes of religious or social functions
- 6. The student should report to the class-in-charge whenever there is a change in her residential address & phone numbers.
- 7. If any student wants to leave the campus for any reason, academic or non-academic should get prior permission from the HOD and the principal.
- 8. Students can come to college either by college bus or by using their own vehicles (Two Wheelers). Travailing by auto-rickshaw or Private buses should be avoided.

- 9. Student should use only the allotted bus and they should board from the permitted place.
- 10. Students should not reserve seats for the co-students in the bus.
- 11. Only Parents and Guardians should come to meet the College in person to discuss the student's progress.
- 12. In the event of violating the rules and regulations of the college, the principal is fully empowered to dismiss the students from the College.
